


1. Demonstrate the existence of a gap between career counseling theories and reality

- Positivist epistemology
 - The utilization of pre-constructed models
 - Traditional career counseling theories seen as an objective process
- □ Contemporary world
 - Counseling interventions as a process of meaning-making



- Criticism: critical analysis of the possibility, origin, value, laws
 and limits of rational knowledge
- □ **Critique** (*kritikê téchne*): ability to separate, judge, decide.
- "The moral of the story":
 Career counseling has been influenced by the tradition of empiricism





Framework of interventions

- Developmental theories
 - A set of process to anticipate decisions
- □ The approach of constructivism
 - The co-construction as a source of satisfaction








Surpass the gap

- Identify the individual narrative and reviewing it
- Defining it through the information that is individually processed
- Naming the context
- A context and the knowledge of it
- Understand the motivational factors





2. Theoretical considerations debated around Life-Designing.

Case studies:



- More explicative rather than explorative or descriptive
- Explore the intra-individual-variability
- Importance of contextual variables
 - Research agenda:
 - Bottom-up
 - Methodologies (e.g., discourse, narrative or ethnographic)



A co-construction perspective integrated into the paradigm of LD

- Reflection on the self and environment
- Receptivity to feedback
- Imagination of possible selves



Counseling process

- Individual narratives and stories
- The expression of emotion
- Discover and reveal one's lives
- •Identification of the salient elements of the selves



Transform the idea into reality

- Motivation- action
- Life stories, not the concepts
 - Condition of an active element within the historic chain... feed
 - Projecting to the future





- Involvement
- Personal choice



3. Process of counseling (LD perspectives)

Individuals are people that construct their selves of how they perceive others reacting to them, and these "others" are not separate and out there

- Inter-dependent relationship
- The importance of identity
- The integration of
 - The personality
 - Adaptability
 - Life themes






Concluding... Some of the challenges:

- □ Self co-construction process






- Important to act, but also to reflect
