


Utilizing One's Talents



Jumpstart is committed to serving children in order to lessen the disparity between success of low-income children to their higher income counterparts.

Jumpstart's Partnerships

Hire 100+ work-study students from MU/Columbia College

Partner with 15 preschool classrooms, serving mostly low-income children ages 3-5 (including Title-1 programs)

Tutors work in small groups with 3 children for the entire year

Jumpstart Columbia is serving more than 250 children in this unique small group setting!

Teams MU students with local children to improve literacy and mathematics skills

Graduate students coordinate the services and train the tutors

AWWWN Partnerships

- Serves 25 different sites
 - All 19 Columbia public elementary schools, 3 middle schools, Boys & Girls Club, Moving Ahead, Columbia Public Library
- 2,500 children and adults tutored annually
- 300 undergraduate and graduate tutors
- 20 Graduate student site coordinators
